Adherence to Antipsychotic Medications for Individuals with Schizophrenia (SAA)

Did you know?

Adherence to Antipsychotic Medications for Individuals with Schizophrenia (SAA) assesses adults 18 years of age and older who have been diagnosed with schizophrenia or a schizoaffective disorder, and were dispensed and remained on an antipsychotic medication for at least 80 percent of their treatment period.* Schizophrenia is a chronic psychiatric disorder that requires ongoing treatment and monitoring. Medication nonadherence is common and a major concern in the treatment of schizophrenia. Using antipsychotic medications as prescribed reduces the risk of relapse or hospitalization.

What can I do?

Patients may stop taking their mental health medications because they feel better and think they no longer need treatment, their family may be pressuring them to stop, or they are afraid the medication is affecting their personality. It is important to perform medication reconciliation at every appointment so you can address your patients' barriers and improve medication adherence and health outcomes.
